## I. Program Overview

The program will arrange young sinologists to go to Shanghai, Qinghai Province or Hainan Province to carry out social practice on topics such as China's reform and opening up and economic development, Chinese history and culture heritage and innovative development, beautiful towns and leisure tourism research and so on.
