

KEYNOTE LECTURE 1

Ideology and Scholarship in the Era of Xi Jinping

Professor Gloria Davies, Monash University

Ideology is a highly overdetermined concept. Much ink has been spilled, and will undoubtedly continue to be spilled, in the analysis and theorising of the what, where, when and why of ideology. The term itself has attracted and continues to attract an expanding spectrum of connotations, a spectrum of simplistic definitions of ideology at one end and refined arguments and hypotheses (and problematisations of these therein) at the other.

A formal ideology, such as that of the Chinese Communist Party, achieves one of its principle aims when people make sense of their lives using its language. This was demonstrably the case in the first three decades of CCP rule when Mao Zedong Thought secured the authority of Party ideology by becoming virtually synonymous with it. Since then, China's Party leaders have preserved his authority but stripped Party ideology of Mao's "solitary voice" 一言堂. Until recently, their wordings and formulations of "Socialism with Chinese Characteristics" sought to reflect a collective-style leadership. The challenge for these Party leaders has been and continues to be that as China has become more cosmopolitan, economically sophisticated and culturally diverse, the popular authority of Party ideology is inevitably diminished, even as it remains integral to China's political culture.

With these issues in mind, this paper considers the relation between ideology and scholarship in the following way. It begins by exploring the implications for academic discourse of Louis Althusser's understanding of ideology as "representing the imaginary relationship of individuals to their real conditions of existence". If we accept that none of us is ideology-free, insofar as ideology conditions how we relate to the world in which we find ourselves and make sense of our lives within it, then the discursive (and disciplinary) differences that condition our scholarship are thus also inescapably ideological. This would then allow us non-signatories to CCP ideology, to compare the discursive requirements of our academic discourse with the discursive requirements of Party ideology as a cultural and linguistic phenomenon of China's party-state system. The comparison would in turn, allow us to reflect on the ramifications of "ideological strengthening" on academic discourse in China in recent years. What it might tell ourselves about our own practices should also not be overlooked.

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Gloria Davies is Professor of Chinese Studies at Monash University and has published widely on modern Chinese intellectual politics and Chinese literary and cultural topics, including *Worrying About China: On Chinese Critical Inquiry* (2007) and *Lu Xun's Revolution: Writing in a Time of Violence* (2013). She is a regular contributor to the China Story Yearbook project based at the Australian Centre on China in the World (CIW), ANU.

KEYNOTE LECTURE 2

Engaging the Masses in the New Republic — Drawing Beautiful Citizens

In the early years of the Republic, after the collapse of the Qing Dynasty, the Chinese people faced a dramatic shift in status. Overnight, they moved from being subjects of an emperor to being citizens of a republic. What did it mean to be a citizen rather than a subject? How did one conduct oneself in this new role? A raft of progressive intellectuals embarked upon programs to educate the people about this new status—China's leading commercial artists from the burgeoning print media of the era were integral to the movement. This paper examines the work of Shen Bochen, Ding Song, and Dan Duyu as they modernised the centuries-old genre of *One Hundred Illustrated Beauties*. In producing a remarkable array of modern, democratic citizen-beauties they helped create the broader consciousness change that transformed every part of Chinese society. The paper shows how the new-style beauty illustrations presented readers with a tantalizing and alluring vision of the new civic consciousness made possible by the Republic. The power of the modern beauties to produce new people for new times was achieved by the artists making a direct contrast of their own work with the beauties of late Qing, by eminent artists Wu Youru and Qiu Shouping. Shen, Ding and Dan's illustrations of beautiful women, as modern citizens, made the Republic an engaging and desirable concept and revealed what its democratic principles might mean for ordinary people in their everyday life.

Louise Edwards publishes on women and gender in China from a cultural and political historical perspective. Her most recent sole-authored books include *Women, Politics and Democracy: Women's Suffrage in China* (Stanford University Press 2008) and *Women Warriors and Wartime Spies of China* (Cambridge University Press 2016). In 2014 two of her earlier books were published in Chinese: *Men and Women in Qing China* has appeared with Peking University Press and *Women, Politics and Democracy* with Jiangsu People's Publishing House. This paper is from her forthcoming book *Citizens of Beauty: Drawing Democratic Dreams in Republican China* (University of Washington Press, 2019).

葛兆光,復旦大學文史研究院及歷史系特聘教授。研究領域為東亞與中國的宗教、思想和文化史。北京大學研究生畢業,曾任揚州師範大學教授、清華大學教授。著有《禪宗與中國文化》、《道教與中國文化》、《中國單思想史一從6世紀到9世紀》、《中國思想史》(兩卷本)、《屈服史及其他一六朝隋唐道教的思想史研究》、《西潮又東風:晚清民初思想、宗教與學術十論》、《宅茲中國:重建有關"中國"的歷史論述》、《何為中國?疆域、民族、文化與歷史》、《歷史中國的內與外:有關中國與周邊概念的再澄清》等。論著曾譯成多種外文,並獲第一屆中國圖書獎、第一屆長江讀書獎、第三屆與第五屆國家圖書獎提名獎、第三屆 Paju Book Award(韓國)、第26屆"亞洲·太平洋"大獎(日本)等。2009年被聘為美國普林斯頓大學第一屆"普林斯頓全球學者"(Princeton Global Scholar)。
